

Seeking Persons with Aphasia Due to Stroke

Help develop a treatment for reading and memory problems in people with aphasia.

The Shirley Ryan AbilityLab is conducting a research study to assess a treatment program for reading and memory in persons with aphasia. Participation requires 4 visits.

If you should qualify for this research study:

- You will complete background assessments of your language and memory skills.
- You will participate in two different versions of a reading treatment.
- You will complete various language tasks, such as reading sentences aloud, repeating sentences.
- You will receive compensation.

Participants must meet the following criteria:

- At least 21 years old
- English-speaking
- Diagnosed with aphasia caused by a stroke
- At least 6-months post-onset
- AND have difficulty communicating
